The results in brief

Mayesbrook Park Campus

- On average, male students gained four qualifications and female students gained six at Levels 1 or 2.
- 12 students gained more than five qualifications at Level 1 and 2, giving them choices for their future education.
- Two-thirds of students gained three or more qualifications at Level 1 and 2, giving them access to college courses.

Erkenwald Campus:

- 56% of students had mental health issues and 22% had medical needs.
- 57% of students obtained 9–4 grade GCSE in English, Maths and English Literature (taught for the first time this year).
- 83% gained grade 9-4 GCSE in short course Sociology, a significant improvement on 2016 results.
- Science exam results were improved too, with 50% gaining 9–4 grade GCSE passes. Three went on to study science at college.
- Three students received home tuition and gained entry-level qualifications in English and Maths.
